### **FALL WATERING SCHEDULE IN EFFECT**

Water two days a week

Residents and businesses are encouraged to cut back their sprinkler and drip irrigation to no more than two days per week through October 31. For optimal efficiency, water between 8 p.m. and 8 a.m. and use the cycle and soak method of sprinkler watering.

The cycle and soak method allows water to soak deep into the soil creating healthy roots and eliminating runoff. To implement, adjust sprinkler clocks to run 3 cycles per watering day with 1 hour between each cycle. Allow each cycle to run 4 minutes for a fixed spray or 8 minutes for a rotating spray head. Monitor and adjust as needed. Hand water dry spots.
