Camping at Kolob Reservoir Requires Online Reservation

Effective May 27, guests planning to camp at Kolob Reservoir are required to reserve and pay for campsite(s) through www.bookyoursite.com. Up to 43 sites—ranging from small, tent-friendly to large, RV and trailer capacity—are available starting at \$50 per night. Discounts for Washington County residents and active military are available.

The reservation process is being implemented following ongoing public health and safety concerns caused by recreational uses. Fees will be used to offset costs of providing and maintaining campsites, including facility management, trash bins and restrooms. Camp hosts will patrol the region and the Washington County Sheriff's Office will be available for enforcement of recreational use policies.

Kolob Reservoir is a nearly 6,000-acre-foot water storage facility owned by the Washington County Water Conservancy District. The primary purpose of the reservoir is to store Virgin River water to meet the water demands of Washington County residents. As such, it's essential that all visitors – campers and day use guests – help protect the reservoir's water quality by cleaning up all trash and reporting any oil and fuel spills.
