Create and display your scarecrow at the 8th annual Scarecrow Walk and haunted canyon event at Red Hills Desert Garden.

- Step 1:** Email your participation form and a high resolution/vector logo, if applicable, to ryanw@wcwcd.org by Friday, September 29.
- Step 2:** Once you've received confirmation from our team, pick-up your scarecrow stakes between September 11 and October 6 from the Washington County Water Conservancy District (WCWCD) office (533 E. Waterworks Dr., St. George).
- Step 3:** Create!
- Step 4:** Deliver & Install
 - Single-scarecrow participants: please deliver your scarecrow to the WCWCD office October 5-6 or to Red Hills Desert Garden on October 9 between 8 am and 5 pm
 - Scarecrow scene participants: please set-up your display at Red Hills Desert Garden, in your assigned area on October 9 or before noon on October 10
- Step 5:** Share your scarecrow: encourage family and friends to visit October 10-31 and share on social media using #rhdgscarecrowwalk
- Step 6:** Pick-up your scarecrow from the garden on November 2. Unclaimed scarecrows will be recycled and/or saved for future use, depending on their condition.



Guidelines

- Individuals and/or groups of all ages may participate.
- WCWCD reserves the right to deny exhibition privileges to any entry considered to be offensive or done in poor taste.
- Entries should be suitable for all ages.
- Scarecrows should be made of durable, fade resistant and weatherproof materials. All accessories should be securely fastened with wire, zip ties or equivalent to withstand windy conditions. Duct tape is insufficient.
- Avoid large banners or backdrops that act as a wind sail.
- Items that disintegrate in the sun or rain, carved pumpkins and/or other materials that will not last until November 1 are discouraged. (i.e. paper, cardboard, duct tape, etc.)
- Preservation of plants is vital. All displays must avoid damaging plants. Spider webbing may not be attached to foliage. Tree trunks and woody branches are acceptable.
- Relevant promotional signs (i.e. social media contests, hashtags, themed signs, etc.) associated with an entry shall be limited to **one sign no larger than 18" x 24"**.
- Business/organization logos will be printed and displayed by garden staff. Send logos to RyanW@wcwcd.org Additional branding may be emphasized through scarecrow theming rather than free-standing signs.
- Any audio devices should be less than 70 decibels and must be timed or motion activated. Sound should not be constantly playing.
- Representatives may not actively promote their organizations in-person.
- Flyers and brochures may not be distributed with an entry.

Reminders

- **Single scarecrow participants** are responsible for delivering their pre-assembled scarecrow October 5-6 or October 10 to WCWCD's office located at 533 E. Waterworks Dr. in St. George during normal business hours, 8 am - 5 pm. You may also deliver it directly to the garden on October 9 from 8 am - 5 pm WCWCD staff will install individual scarecrow submissions at Red Hills Desert Garden.
- **Scarecrow scene participants** will oversee their respective installation at Red Hills Desert Garden on October 9 or before noon on October 10.
- All participants may pick up their scarecrow between 8 am and 5 pm on November 2 at Red Hills Desert Garden.
